Adding to Your Faith...Knowledge 2 Peter 1:5-7

Over the last couple of weeks we've been giving thought in this part of the bulletin to Peter's inspired encouragement to Christians to grow, found in 2 Peter 1:5-11 — "add to your faith..." We've looked at diligence and moral excellence already, and the next step in his exhortation is knowledge.

Now these days knowledge in the religious world is not necessarily in fashion. "Spirituality "is all the rage in popular culture, feeling the "spirit" is the goal of the worshipper, and creating a transcendent experience is the priority of many religious organizations. Adding knowledge is generally much, much farther down the priority list. But is minimizing knowledge the way to authentic, God-pleasing, redeeming Christianity?

Knowledge has always been important to God. Do you remember the passages out of Hosea (4:6) — "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. Because you have rejected knowledge, I also will reject you from being My priest. Since you have forgotten the law of your God, I also will forget your children"? There's nothing about being destroyed for lack of a transcendent experience in this passage or anywhere else. And yet, is God just all about being "big brained" - forget about the heart? By no means! And as a matter of fact, let's look at this passage a little more closely.

This idea of knowledge is about more than just head stuff. Knowledge in the Scripture is oftentimes used as in "Adam knew his wife Eve and they had a son" — relationship knowledge. This is in fact the major emphasis of the word in the prophecy of Hosea; that's why the book starts out with a relationship parable from Hosea's personal life. Knowledge is about knowing, really knowing, in a relationship sort of way, the Lord. Emotion, relationship, and a sense of covenant (in the truest and deepest sense of the concept) are all part of this biblical idea of growing in knowledge.

But did you notice in the Hosea 4:6 passage that it ended with a reference to what we might call "headknowledge", too? He said, "Since you have forgotten the law of your God, I also will forget your children." Forgetting the "law of your God" is a rebuke about Israel's not learning and not knowing what God has said, what the Scripture teaches. Instead, they did their own thing. Indeed, sometimes it was complete departure and worship of Baal, but at other times it was the infamous "sin of Jeroboam" in which God was being worshipped after Israel's preferred fashion (including images to represent God, altars under every green tree, a priesthood from other than the family of Aaron, and "alternate" high holy days). This offended God and He accused them of not knowing Him. To illustrate, nothing will break a romantic moment faster than uttering someone else's name in the midst of a intimate encounter. In other words, if you want to know someone relationally; you need to know their name, eye color, preferences, etc., too. If we want to know God relationally, we need to know His word.

You see relational knowledge of God is, oddly enough — odd to our modern minds, anyway — founded on teachings about God. We're used to compartmentalizing knowledge and relationship, but in spiritual matters these things are interdependent.

Without knowledge we do not — we cannot — know the truth about spiritual reality; we cannot know (if you know what I mean) God's "eye color" or preferences. It is through the Scriptures, with all its stories and commands, that we find out about God's nature — His holiness, His justice, His mercy, His patience, His loyalty and faithfulness, and His willingness to "pull the trigger" on punishment on the sinful. We find out about His expectation of obedience, how He defines love, and what is necessary for us to be in covenant with Him.

Without biblical knowledge all we have is a lot of spiritual passion that is destined to be dissipated by every wind of doctrine and channeled to the wrong paths. Check out the status of the more fashionably liberal denominations in Christendom, who stand for very little (some have actually embraced homosexuality, goddess theology, and "white magic") and are experiencing a rapid decline in numbers and involvement (see for example *The Empty Pew*, Thomas C. Reeves and the latest Barna surveys).

Without biblical knowledge we just like ancient Israel — soon begin to displease God. We start to work harder at pleasing ourselves in worship (what we like), and tell ourselves that if we please ourselves, surely we are pleasing God, too.

On the other hand, when you are "diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, accurately handling the word of truth." (2 Timothy 2:15) you know how to answer the Tempter (see Matt. 4:1-11), how to please God in worship, which pattern is God's and how to follow it (1 Tim. 1:13,14), how to endure the suffering and persecutions that come our way (2 Cor. 12:9,10), and what unseen things we should be seeing (2 Cor. 4:18) and more.

We must add to our faith biblical knowledge, which in turn will add to our relational knowledge with the Lord. Study! Learn! Know!
