- "Rain? What's rain? Fine, Noah, let it rain. See if we care!" Noah's pre-flood generation
- "No one will ever know that we held some of our contribution back. They'll all think we gave it all!" Ananias and Sapphira
- "It's just one Jewish carpenter. Crucifying Him for the stability of the Roman hold on Judea is a small price to pay" Pilate

- "One little one-night-stand won't make any difference; no one will ever know." David regarding Bathsheba

### Are You a Disciple, or Just a Member?

Yes, I know. Discipleship and membership in the Lord's church are supposed to be the same. Acts 2:47 tells us that the early disciples in Jerusalem from the day of Pentecost were "praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved." "Their number" was the church, so yes, discipleship and membership should be the same.

But we also know from a practical point of view that sometimes disciples cool off in their fervor and zeal and "settle in" to become "mere members". Consequently, there are sometimes churches, full of members, only some of which are really disciples. Which category do you think you'd fit in? Although the following list is far from comprehensive, it might serve as a brief self-test (see 2 Corinthians 13:5).

- Disciples say, "Let's go!" when it comes to sharing the Gospel; mere members tend to say, "Come to us."
- Disciples remember poignantly their salvation and Christ's love still compels them; mere members seldom if ever go there anymore.
- Disciples are lovingly and courageously bold in their faith; mere members don't want to rock anyone's boat, look too charismatic, or offend anyone.
- Disciples say, "I'll volunteer to do anything for the Lord or His church!"; mere members says, "Let someone else do it."
- Disciples say, "I'll give sacrificially"; mere members tend to say, "I'll give a little, but not too much."
- Disciples consistently put Jesus and His priorities first; mere members will put Jesus second, if something "more important" comes up.
- Disciples may sin, but immediately repent and work hard at change — no matter how often they've messed up; mere members have sometimes given up on trying to overcome certain weaknesses, simply banking on the Lord's grace to cover it.
- Disciples change and grow; mere members are satisfied to "stand pat" with the status quo.

- Disciples still listen carefully to the Lord; mere members sometimes get their spiritual advice from the world, its celebrities, its philosophies, and its priorities.
- Disciples are hungry and thirsty for righteousness; mere members are satisfied.
- Disciples let no persecution stop them or slow them down; mere members quickly retract and back down when resistance is met.
- Discipleship always gets something out of worship; mere members sometimes do and sometimes don't.

So which category did you tend to be in? The Lord, we are certain, will be coming back one day for His disciples. But will He also be coming for "mere members"? That (Revelation 3:15,16) seems — well — less certain.

Is it possible to return to being a disciple? Gladly, yes! Jesus said, "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline; therefore be zealous and repent. Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me." (Revelation 3:19, 20).
