It would be hard to overstate how great Vacation Bible School was this past week! Let me list just a few great things about this week...

- ♦ We had an average of 43 kids every day.
- ♦ We had a high of 15 children (ranging in age from 3 through 9) from Darlene Cordaro's day care.
- We averaged 20 adults and teens daily to work our VBS (this puts the number of kids, adults, and teens at about 63 people Monday through Wednesday).
- We had many of Darlene's day care parents at our Open House, who came to our church building for the very first time. The auditorium was fairly packed.
- Many parents expressed a desire to come to our regular worship services.
- We invited our attending parents to an excellent video series we're beginning on Sunday evening at the building entitled "Truth Be Told". It's on evidences for Creation and against Evolution.
- ♦ We involved numerous other adults and teens in preparation for VBS (decorations, food, advertisement, etc.). Involvement feeds and strengthens our faith!
- We had an impressively decorated church building—upstairs and down—thanks to the ideas of Kass Dumas and Ann Casella and the hard work of numerous adults and teens.
- Park (and perhaps Mark) will be going to Darlene's day care once a week to do an hour of VBS-style songs and a Bible story.
- We made contact with a local religious group's leader to start discussing the Bible on a regular basis.

There are so many people to thank for all the hard work and involvement that it's hard to know where to start—and I'd probably forget someone! But you all should not only be given heartfelt thanks but you should also held up as great examples of Christian dedication—backing up your profession of faith in Jesus with deeds in keeping with your faith.

Most of all, however, we need to thank the Lord for blessing our efforts with good results. Please continue to pray for happy outcomes as we follow up on the opportunities we've been given to share the message of Jesus to more and more precious souls.

BY LOVING PEOPLE Mankind

The creator of the comic strip "Peanuts", Charles Shultz, was remarkably perceptive of the human heart in a remark in one of his famous comic strips. Linus, one of the main characters, says with a perfectly straight face, "I love humanity, it's people I can't stand!" We're supposed to laugh at the irony, but sadly it is all too common and true to laugh much.

Often, as we hear great lessons from God's inspired word on the topic of evangelism, we find ourselves soaring to great, new levels of commitment, urgency, and dedication. And as we are exhorted to love men's souls, urging us to be great souls winners, we may find ourselves saying, "Yes, I do love men's souls and I want to be a great soul winner for Christ!!"

But what happens after the last soulful "Amen, let's win the world for Jesus!" is uttered? After the last echoes of all the noise and excitement fades? As we go back into the world? We begin to meet individual, lost souls, and we get tongue tied and lose our nerve. The newfound zeal for sharing Jesus suddenly just dissipates like steam from a tea kettle—to someone's eternal loss. And when we reflect on our day, we wonder, "What's wrong with me? I was sure that I loved the lost world; what went wrong?" Maybe it is that we have the same problem with people as Linus does—we love humanity but have a difficult time with individuals on a personal level.

Many times it has to do with one of two rather unflattering problems:

- we're afraid of what others will think of us. We want to be cool, want people to think well of us, don't want them to ridicule us, or hurt our feelings or...
- ers have for the truth of the Gospel.

 we are so self-absorbed that we become unconscious about the eternal needs oth-

Jesus didn't have such problems dealing with people, because He *loved* them. As He talked to individuals about their souls, His popularity wasn't in view, being cool wasn't a consideration, and being attacked by those opposed to His message wasn't even on His "radar". He just loved them. It was not about Him; it was all about us. Jesus came to serve, not to be served—to provide eternity for others, not be the coolest rabbi of the day. Isn't that the way it should be in our lives? Isn't that one of the things that attracts you personally to Jesus—that you know He cares for you as one person? That He died for your personally? When we can instill that same love in our own hearts for one person, and just "get out of the way", we really will have the evangelistic zeal God's people should have doing the work He commissioned each of us to do.

When was the last time you personally came up and shook a visitor's hand, got his name and address, and visited him because you were interested in his soul? The last time you asked the preacher about a contact that could use a visit? Called and encouraged a wayward member to return to God's fold? The last time you cared enough about an individual's soul—so precious that its worth is more than the wealth of a million worlds, so precious that Christ bled and died for it—that you did something?

Don't get caught in Linus' error. We cannot say that we love men's souls, and yet not make any effort or attempt to win an individual to Christ; nor can we say that we love the Lord's church, but make no effort to know names of its people, encourage its members to greater faith, or to work side by side with its individuals.

You can only love mankind by showing love to its individuals.
