GOADS AND NAILS

"The words of the wise are like goads, their collected sayings like firmly embedded nails--given by one Shepherd." Ecclesiastes 12:11,

The Scripture is like a goad. Its words will prod you and poke you and cause you to feel uncomfortable until you obey them. They will make you go where you would not ordinarily go, and do what you would not ordinarily do. All of us who read and take the Scriptures seriously have felt this goad pricking at us and prodding us along

Skeptic David Hume was seen walking in the snow long before daybreak one frigid morning. He, along with many others, was making his way to a little chapel where George Whitefield was preaching. Someone who knew the skeptic said to him, "Mr. Hume, I didn't know you believed in the Scriptures!" He responded, "I don't, but that man in the chapel does, and I can't stay away." There is something about the words of Scripture that goad even the skeptic. He can't silence the

message because they are prodding at him, pushing at him, exploding silently in his mind.

Solomon doesn't stop with "goads". He goes on to say that the words of Scripture are like "nails firmly fixed". You can hang on to them and hold fast to them in times of danger. They will give your life

stability, when the storm comes.



Once when I was deeply troubled, my mind turned again and again to words spoken by Jesus to His worried disciples in the fourteenth chapter of John, "Let not your heart be troubled." I was gripped by those two words, "Let not..." They said to me that a troubled heart is subject to the will of a Christian. He can let his heart be troubled, or he can let it not be troubled. The ground

for letting it not be troubled is in the words that immediately follow: "You believe in God, believe also in Me." When the realization struck me that Jesus was with me and had the wisdom and power to take care of that which was troubling me, I felt the load of my anxiety lifted. That is the power of Scripture.

Why does it have this unique power? The reason is that "the collected sayings...have been given by one Shepherd." These are inspired, God-breathed words. Put them to the test in your own life.
