## Do You Know Him?

"Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony of our Lord or of me His prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel according to the power of God...for which I was appointed a preacher and an apostle and a teacher. For this reason I also suffer these things, but I am not ashamed; for I know whom I have believed and I am convinced that He is able to guard what I have entrusted to Him until that day." 2 Timothy 1:8, 11, 12, NAS95.

Paul was a man that suffered a lot for the name of Jesus, just like it had been foretold of him just before the time of his conversion (Acts 9:16). He had been imprisoned, flogged, beaten, ship-wrecked, constantly on the move, in dangerous situations, hungry, naked, and worried about the churches. Being a disciple had meant trouble to him since the beginning, when King Aretas of Damascus had tried to arrest him only a few days after his baptism. How could he be now inviting (2 Tim. 1:8) Timothy to suffer with him?

Perhaps he could endure the suffering and invite Timothy, or any of us, to join him in suffering, because he knew the One he had believed. It was Paul's knowledge, his personal knowledge as of a long-time friend, of Jesus, the One whom he'd believed, that led Paul to the confidence that nothing he or any disciple suffered or did for Christ's name would be forgotten or overlooked.

What did he know about Jesus? He knew Jesus to be fair. Never would Jesus allow evil deeds to go unpunished, unjust actions not receive their due recompense, or inequities remain unbalanced. He knew that Jesus is good, and never would He let His people remain impoverished, disadvantaged, or handicapped forever. Paul knew about the trustworthiness of Jesus and knew the Lord's word about the reward, the rest, the crown, and eternal life were more solid than the very earth itself. All these things and more were the absolute proof to Paul that nothing done for the Kingdom's sake would go unrewarded and forgotten.

It freed Paul to refuse to trifle with revenge on those who had treated him so shamefully, had insulted him, had tried to have him killed; the Lion of Judah was his avenger. It liberated him from the foolishness of striving for fame and boasting, because there was only one recognition to seek, the Lord's. He had no need to worry about worldly reputation, because being a good and faithful servant of Jesus was the only reputation Paul had ever really wanted or needed.

But the trick is to *know* Him. Paul had spent time with Him in prayer, in His word, and in observation of the Lord's deeds (that He is faithful). So he wasn't ashamed—not of the Gospel, not of his sufferings, not of other faithful disciples.

Do you know Him?

"For this reason we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it." Hebrews 2:1, NAS95.

### WHO YOU GONNA SERVE?

"When the LORD saw that they humbled themselves, the word of the LORD came to Shemaiah, saying, 'They have humbled themselves so I will not destroy them, but I will grant them some measure of deliverance, and My wrath shall not be poured out on Jerusalem by means of Shishak. But they will become his slaves so that they may learn the difference between My service and the service of the kingdoms of the countries." 2 Chronicles 12:7, 8, NAS95.

God was going to place Judah under Egypt's thumb; Judah was going to be serving Egyptian masters again. Not, of course, like the days between the times of Joseph and Moses, but it would be hard and harsh. Egyptians would be oppressing the young and old, rich and poor. Pharaoh's taxes would be overburdening and the Egyptian armies would be eating everything else like locusts.

Why? Because Judah hadn't wanted to obey or serve their true king, the LORD. Serving the LORD was just too hard; God's ways were too burdensome; He just wanted too much. So the LORD had decided to remind Judah what hard servitude was really all about. They needed to remember the difference between service to God and the slavery to men.

Here's a lesson for us to remember always, too, because we tend to forget: sin is the cruel taskmaster paying us death as our wages, God is the loving Father giving us life.

But we do often have a rather selective memory like Judah. We forget about the harshness of sin. The temptations we face give us temporary amnesia about the iron-fisted despotism of sin that prompted Paul to write, "For what I am doing, I do not understand; for I am not practicing what I would like to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate," Romans 7:15, NAS95. Somehow the shame, guilt, and degradation of slavery to unrighteousness conveniently skips our minds. And as Satan whispers to our hearts again, "You shall not surely die,"we willingly, obliviously walk into the the same old consequences of sin, like lambs to the slaughter. And Paul adds, "Therefore what benefit were you then deriving from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the outcome of those things is death." Romans 6:21, NAS95.

We need instead to remember that Jesus came "...that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10), that "...this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments; and His commandments are not burdensome," (1 John 5:3), and that Jesus is "...gentle and humble in heart, and YOU WILL FIND REST FOR YOUR SOULS." (Matthew 11:29). Have we forgotten?

May we never reach a state of forgetful rebelliousness, so that God might need to teach us the difference between His service and the slavery to sin.

O Lord, please do not turn us over to slavery of sin again. We know You to be a loving Father, whose commands are not burdensome, whose intent is not to crush us or kill, but to lift us up and give us true life. Thank you for our great deliverer, Jesus, who delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us into His Kingdom of life and freedom. In our great Deliverer's name
